Dear members and friends of Franklin United Methodist Church,

It is hard to believe that more than seven months have now passed and we continue to find ourselves in the midst of a global pandemic that continues to drastically alter our lives. While much has changed, the mission of the church remains. We continue “to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world” by “seeking to be a community where all can experience meaningful relationship with God, grow in Christ, and reach out in love to others; a community where all can love and be loved and be accepted as you are.” We continue to live into this mission and vision through our worship together, life together, and work together.

### **Worship Together**

*We worship together every Sunday at 10am.* Our worship has evolved rapidly over these last few months, moving from a pretty informal time of checking-in to a hybrid service where in-person-in-the-sanctuary worshippers and virtual worshippers can see and hear and interact with one another. No matter how (virtual or in-person) or where you may be worshipping (in the church, at home, or on the beach) you will have the same ability to participate in our shared worship.

*Our services continue, at present, to meet virtually. Note: Only worship volunteers and their families are participating in-person, in the sanctuary, at this time. If you would like to help by being a reader, usher (in-person or virtual), greeter, or work with the audio/visual aspects of worship, please let me or the Church Office know and we can help get you on the volunteer schedule. On the day you come to volunteer, please bring your family with you to worship.

### **Life Together**

Faith cannot be lived alone. As people of faith, we are called to “shoulder the burdens, share the risks, and celebrate the joys of fellow members of the body of Christ” (*¶219, Book of Discipline—2016*). We are called to live and share life together—to encourage and support one another along life’s Way.

Life Together small groups provide an opportunity for each of us to read and discuss Scripture together and encourage and support one another along the Way. There are currently two opportunities for you to meet with others in small—Life Together—groups: Tuesdays and Thursdays at 7:30pm. These gatherings currently meet virtually and run for one hour or less.
