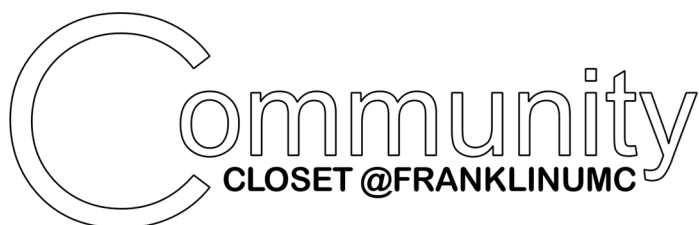

The Community Closet collects and distributes new and gently used clothing, *free of charge*, to anyone and everyone in the community. The closet is open regularly and by appointment.

Share

The Community Closet accepts donations of:

- new and gently used clothing for all ages and sizes (please make sure all pre-loved clothing is washed and free of stains, pet dander, etc.)
- shoes for all ages and sizes
- *NEW* socks and undergarments (still in packaging)
- Winter wear (accepted seasonally in the Fall and Winter)

Please note, *we do not take non-clothing items*. Please do not drop-off blankets, furniture, books, or other items unless explicitly asked for.

Drop-off Instructions

All donations should be dropped off inside the main entrance of the Franklin United Methodist Church (82 W. Central St., Franklin)

Monday-Friday, between 8a-1p,
and Sundays, between 9:30-11a.

Please place all donations in the labeled bin. Donations should *never* be left outside the building.

If you would like to receive a receipt for tax purposes, please come to the Church Office during posted business hours.

Meet & Serve

The Community Closet is staffed by volunteers who sort and fold donations and help neighbors find the items they are looking for. Some lifting may be required. Chairs can be provided for those who prefer to sit. All volunteers must be able to navigate stairs in order to enter the closet. Volunteers are typically scheduled in groups of no more than eight people. Children and Youth are encouraged to volunteer alongside a parent or guardian.

Volunteers serve primarily during regular open hours. Signup to serve by going to franklinumc.org/volunteer.
